2022/2023

Lanark County EcDev Website Orientation + Training

A series of virtual training and familiarization presentations for investlanarkcounty.ca launched in 2022 to the county council, lower-tier municipalities, and stakeholders as requested.

Workforce Attraction Social Media Marketing

Develop and implement ongoing content specific to workforce attraction through social media. The Facebook and Instagram accounts will promote the county as a place to live and work, directed at Millennials and Gen Zers who are at the forefront of and entering the workforce.

Business Support Awareness Social Media Account

The new awareness social media account will be solely dedicated to promoting resources, events and training designed to support business growth and development submitted through the Lanark County Economic Development website.

Red Tape Reduction Virtual Forum

Valley Heartland will work with municipal stakeholders to host a forum for businesses to better understand permits, fees, and processing times across the county, with individual community breakout rooms. The forum will include a facilitated interactive brainstorming session that businesses can participate in to put forth ideas on how municipalities can create pathways for express development processes, and identify improvements related to approvals and red tape reduction where possible. A graphic recording and summary of the brainstorming session will be provided to all stakeholders.

Lanark County Eh! Podcast

Launch a bi-monthly economic development podcast that features local community leaders engaged in honest conversations around relevant community development topics such as affordable housing, workforce development, business growth, rural innovation, downtown revitalization, and community reinvestment.

Starring Lanark County Project

This project would be a one-time, year-long project designed to help businesses and lower-tiers navigate and capitalize on film and television production across the county. The project would include the development of templates, resources, training, and marketing materials for municipalities and businesses.

#NoFoodWasted Lanark County Challenge

The #NoFoodWasted Challenge is a one-time, year-long initiative to educate and support businesses in reducing food waste in the foodservice industry. As a result, the restaurant can learn to reduce food waste, help the environment, and save the business money in the long run. The initiative will engage restaurants, bakeries, cafes, and other foodservice businesses. Participation is free and open to all foodservice businesses. Benefits include:

Zero WastED

Includes incremental workshops followed by 1-to-1 support to learn different strategies and tools for monitoring and reducing food waste in the businesses. Topics include:

- Food Waste & Menu Audits
- Systems for forecasting, ordering and prepping
- Reducing Pre-Consumer Food Waste
- Reducing Post-Consumer Waste

*Workshop will include downloadable workbook, tools, and templates

Consumer Awareness

Participating business will be provided:

- Tabletop Signs
- Window Decals
- Digital Signage
- Social Media Posts
- Images and literature for their websites

County-wide awareness about the challenge will be promoted to consumers through radio ads, social media and press releases.

In partnership with Lanark County, a pre-recorded webinar would be developed to help businesses understand how Lanark County makes purchases and improve their chances of becoming a local county supplier. The webinar would be available on the county and economic development website.

Annual Lanark County Funders Forum

Valley Heartland will host the inaugural annual funders forum that will feature a variety of local, provincial, and national funders providing overviews on funding opportunities for businesses, municipalities and fourth pillar non-profits. The forum is an opportunity to learn how to apply for funding, what types of projects are being funded, and get tips on creating a successful funding proposal.
